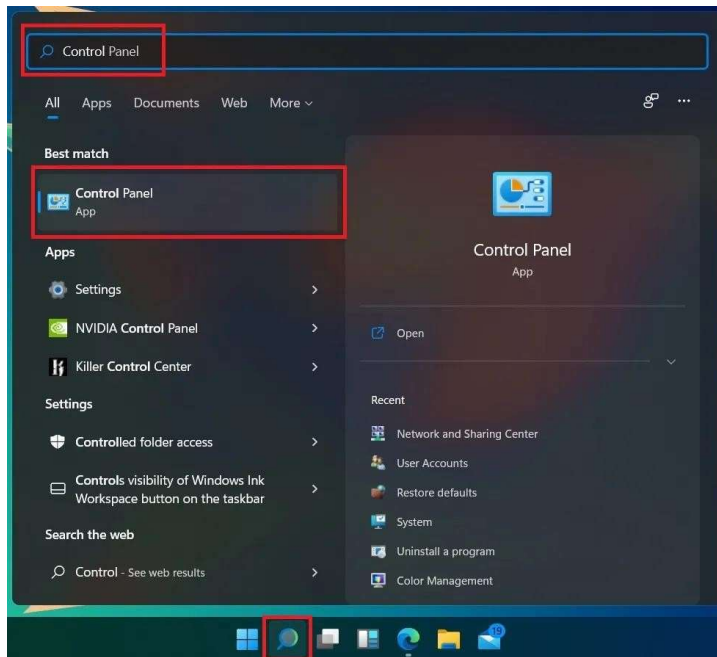


Eduroam configuration steps for Windows User

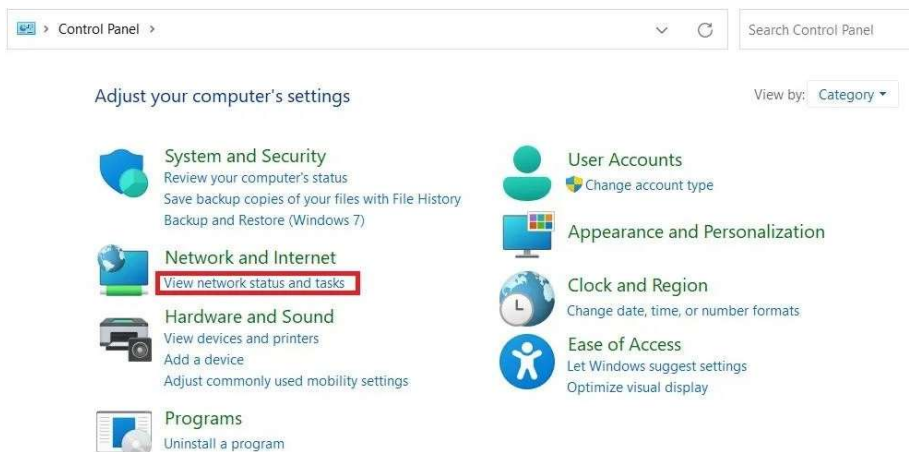
Connect with SSID: **eduroam** from available Wi-Fi connection on your Windows machine. Enter your internet access **username@ad.iitj.ac.in** and password and click on okay to access internet services. Plz add **@ad.iitj.ac.in** before your username.

In some Windows machines, above mentioned steps will not work due to manually enable security or updates then you need to configure the same manually via following steps.

1. On your Windows device open search, type Control Panel and open the Control Panel application.



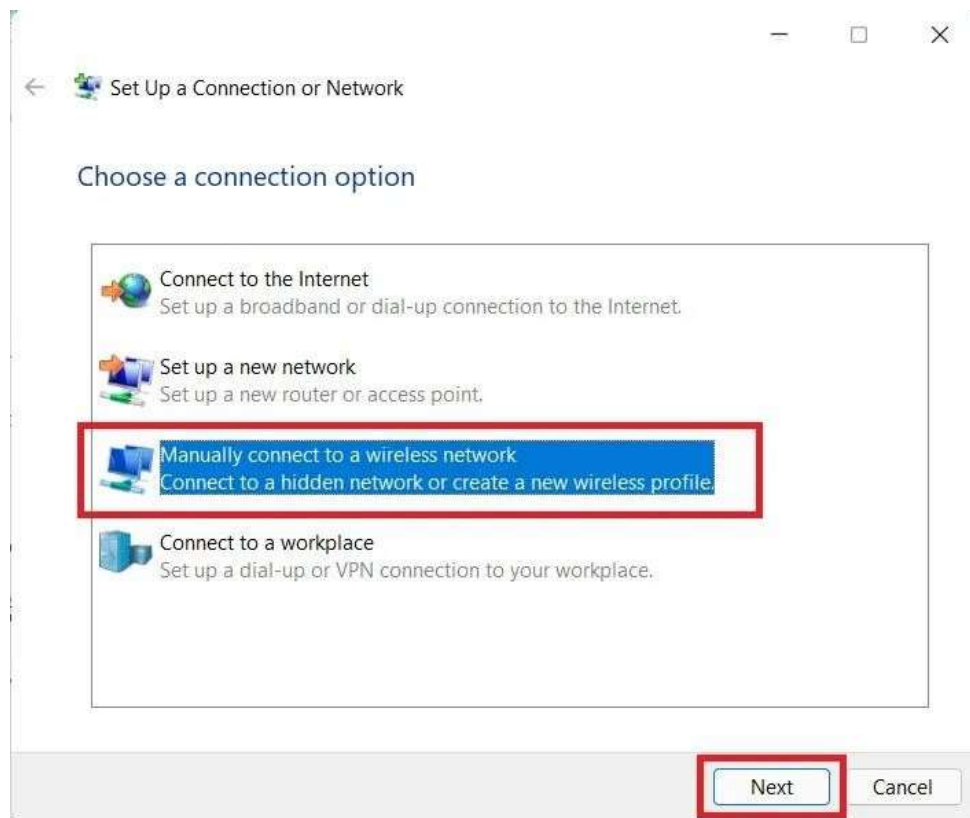
2. Once the Control Panel window is open click on [View network status and tasks].



3. Look for Network and Sharing Window and click on [Set up a new connection or network].

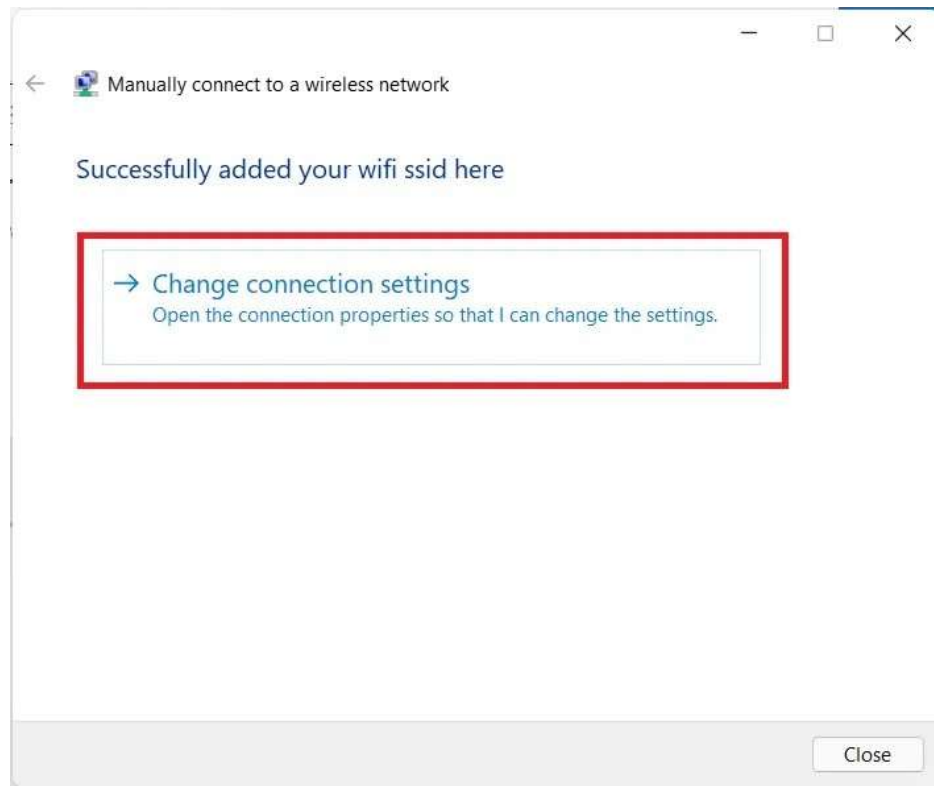


4. Now click on [Manually connect to a wireless network] followed by clicking Next.



5. In the Network name field type Wi-Fi SSID name: **eduroam** In the Security type select WPA2-Enterprise from dropdown list and click on Next.

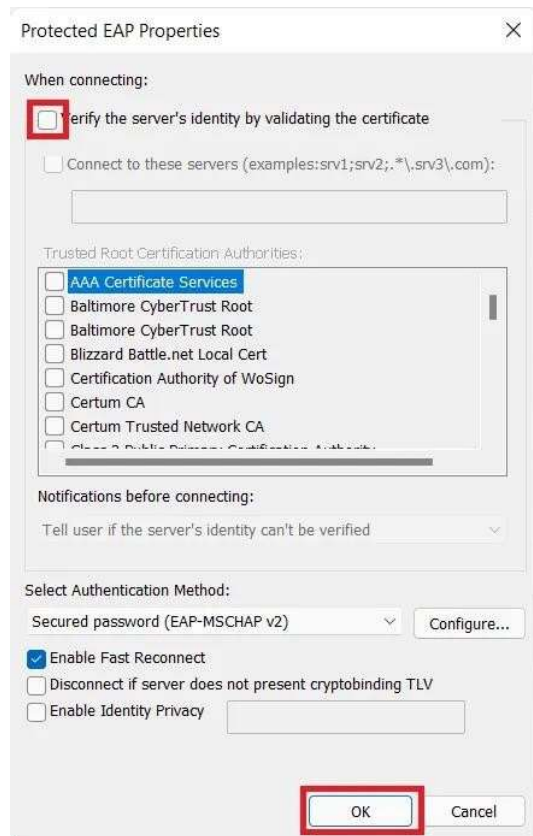
6. You will now be presented with a Successfully added your wifi ssid **eduroam** message. However, you are not finished yet. Let's click on [Change connection settings].



7. Now click on settings under [Security] tab.



8. Un-Check Verify the server's identity by validating the certificate and then click OK.



9. Once back on Wireless Network Properties click on [Advanced Settings].



10. Select the [checkbox] for Specify authentication mode under Advanced settings. Choose [User authentication] from the dropdown and click on [Save credentials]



11. Now enter your internet access username@ad.iitj.ac.in and password, followed by clicking on OK. Plz add @ad.iitj.ac.in before your username.
