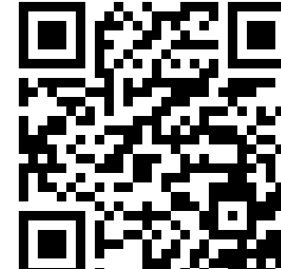

JODHPUR CITY

Jodhpur is the second-largest city of the north-western Indian state of Rajasthan after its capital Jaipur. It is historic capital of the Kingdom of Marwar, founded in 1459 by Rao Jodha, a Rajput chief of the Rathore clan. Jodhpur is a famous tourist spot with a palace, fort, and temples, set in the stark landscape of the Thar Desert. It's also known as the Blue City due to the dominant color scheme of its buildings in old town. The old city circles the Mehrangarh Fort and is bounded by a wall with several gates. Jodhpur lies near the geographic centre of the Rajasthan state, which makes it a convenient base for travel in a region much frequented by tourists.

Culture

Jodhpur has culturally been known by the name of Jodhana by the locals. The city is famous for its food and its popularity can be judged by the fact that one can find sweet shops named "Jodhpur Sweets" in many cities throughout India. Being at the onshore of Thar Desert, life has been influenced by ways of select nomadic tribes (so-called "gypsy" groups – Banjara in Hindi – have settled in some parts of the city). Jodhpur has distinct cultural identity through its food and is famous for its Mirchi Bada, Rabdi Ghewar and Mawa Kachori.

Tourism

Jodhpur's most notable attractions are Mehrangarh Fort which overlooks upon the city, the blue bylanes of the old city, Umaid Bhawan Palace, Jaswant Thada, and the Ghanta Ghar, or Clock Tower. Tourists are also within proximity to Mandore Garden, Kaylana Lake and Garden, Balsamand Lake, Machia Biological Park, Rao Jodha Desert Rock Park, Ratanada Ganesh Temple, Toorji Ka Jhalra, Sardar Samand Lake and Palace, Masooria Hills, Veer Durgadas Smarak (monument, park, and museum), Surpura Dam and Bhim Bhadak Cave. Other attractions of people are at markets of food, antique items, traditional clothes and traditional shoes (also called Jodhpuri Mojari) held in Jodhpur. Mahamandira, a temple consecrated to Sri Jalandharnath, is known for its murals showing ascetics in yoga poses and murals bearing inscriptional records of the dignitaries visiting the shrine which includes Charanas, nobles, and the Rajas.

INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATIONS



PROCESS



STEP 01

The international student is required to confirm acceptance of the offer within 7 days of receiving the admission letter. This confirmation must be submitted both through the SII Portal and via email to the Office of the International Relations Office (IRO).

STEP 02

The student is required to submit the annual fee in accordance with the fee structure. A copy of the payment receipt must be sent to the Office of Academics for fee verification. Once the payment is verified, the student will be notified of the date for academic registration.

STEP 03

The Office of Student will assign a hostel room to the student, equipped with the necessary furniture. The room will be prepared and made ready for the student's use, ensuring that all basic facilities are in place prior to their arrival. However, the student is required to purchase his bedding items, toiletries etc. from the campus store.

STEP 04

The international student is required to submit a medical examination report from a certified doctor, which must be verified by the IITJ doctor at the Health Centre. If the IITJ doctor is not satisfied with the medical report or if the report is not available, the student will be required to undergo a medical checkup.

STEP 05

The Office of Academics will register the student in the ERP system and generate the student's Roll Number. The student will then be required to update their personal and educational details in the ERP module.

STEP 06

The Office of Academics will verify the educational and personal details entered in the ERP system against the student's original documents. The verification process will be considered complete only when all documents have been successfully verified. If any document is missing, the verification will remain incomplete.

STEP 07

Upon arrival at the Institute, the International student must apply for FRRO registration through the Office of Students within 14 days. After the FRRO registration is completed, Form-C 'Arrival Report of Foreigner in the Institute' and Form-S 'Foreign Student Information System' will be generated.

STEP 08

The complete information of registered students will be shared with the Computer Center for the generation of email IDs and Wi-Fi credentials. These credentials will be sent to the newly registered students via their personal email addresses. Additionally, the Student Identity Cards will be issued to registered students.

TOURIST ATTRACTION

Mehrangarh Fort



Jodhpur is a city in the Thar Desert of the northwest Indian state of Rajasthan. Its 15th-century Mehrangarh Fort is a former palace that's now a museum, displaying weapons, paintings, and elaborate royal palanquins (sedan chairs). Set on a rocky outcrop, the fort overlooks the walled city, where many buildings are painted the city's iconic shade of blue. This vibrant color gives Jodhpur its nickname, "The Blue City."

Umaid Bhawan



Historical palace museum with royal antiques, a vintage car collection, and panoramic city views. Enjoy a royal ambiance and the charm of a bygone era in its well-preserved surroundings. Visitors can explore the opulent interiors, lush gardens, vintage car collection, and the fascinating blend of Art Deco and traditional Rajput architecture, making it a must-visit destination in Jodhpur.

Jaswant Thada



Serene historical monument surrounded by lush greenery and a tranquil lake, ideal for peaceful walks and reflective moments amidst intricate marble architecture. Visitors can admire the beautifully carved details, enjoy the serene ambiance, and experience the rich cultural heritage. The cenotaph is built out of intricately carved sheets of Makrana marble. These sheets are extremely thin and polished to emit a warm glow when illuminated by the Sun.

Mandore Garden



Historic garden complex with temples, cenotaphs, and a museum, known for its serene strolls, cultural exhibits, and vibrant evening illuminations. Includes a toy train and food options

Toorji's Step Well



The Step Well Square is a mini-architectural tour with the Toorji's Step Well at the center, and almost 250 yrs of building tradition on view. It was built in the 1740s.

Ghanta Ghar



Bustling market area around a historic clock tower, known for local shopping and vibrant street life. Showcases traditional architecture amidst the daily hustle.

Dance and Folk Music

Camel races, beauty contests, and other events are part of the festival. It celebrates all things camel in Pushkar, Bikaner, Jaisalmer, and other locations annually. This unique event has camel racing and beauty pageants for everyone.

Architectural Heritage



Rajasthan is known for its architectural history with impressive forts and palaces built by Rajput monarchs showcasing intricate decorations and carvings. Famous sites include Umaid Bhavan Palace, Dilwara Temples, and Nakoda Jain Temple.

Cuisine



Rajasthani food, inspired by its dry climate and royal heritage, is full of powerful spices and ancient traditions. Dal Baati Churma, Gatte ki Sabzi, and Ker Sangri are lentil, dairy, and grain meals. Savory Pyaaz Kachori, Mirchi Vada, and sweet Ghevar and Mawa Kachori are popular.

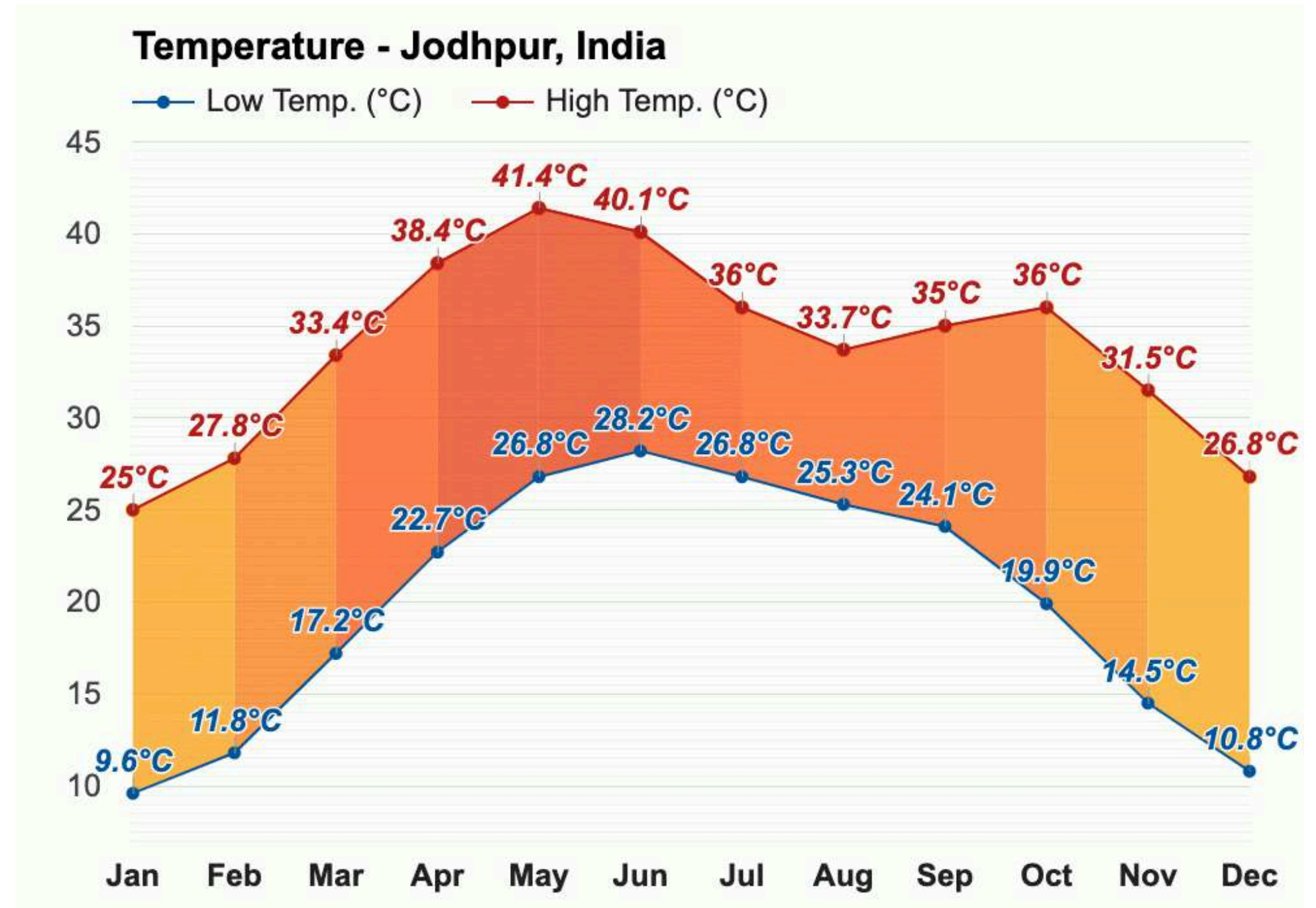

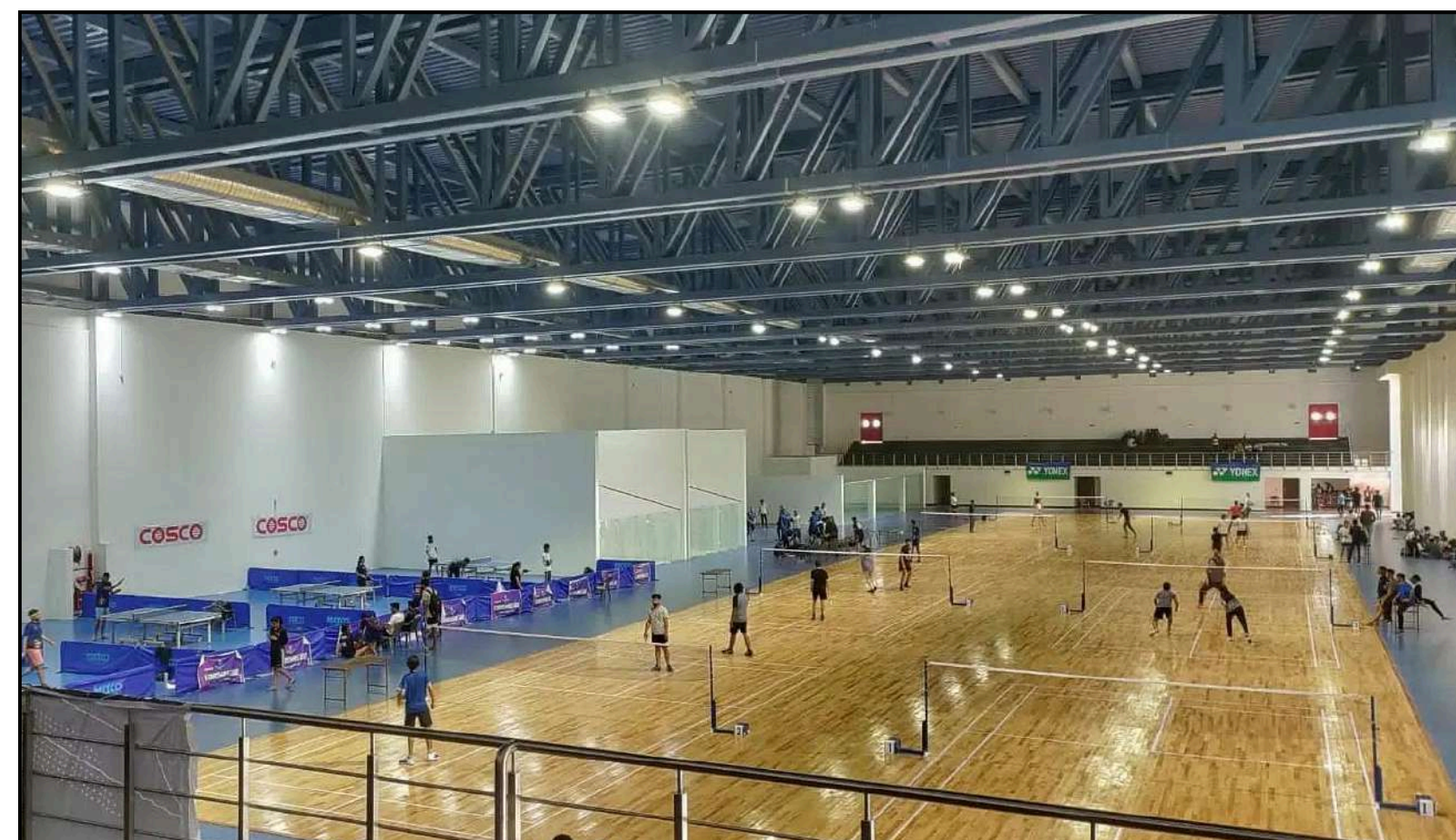
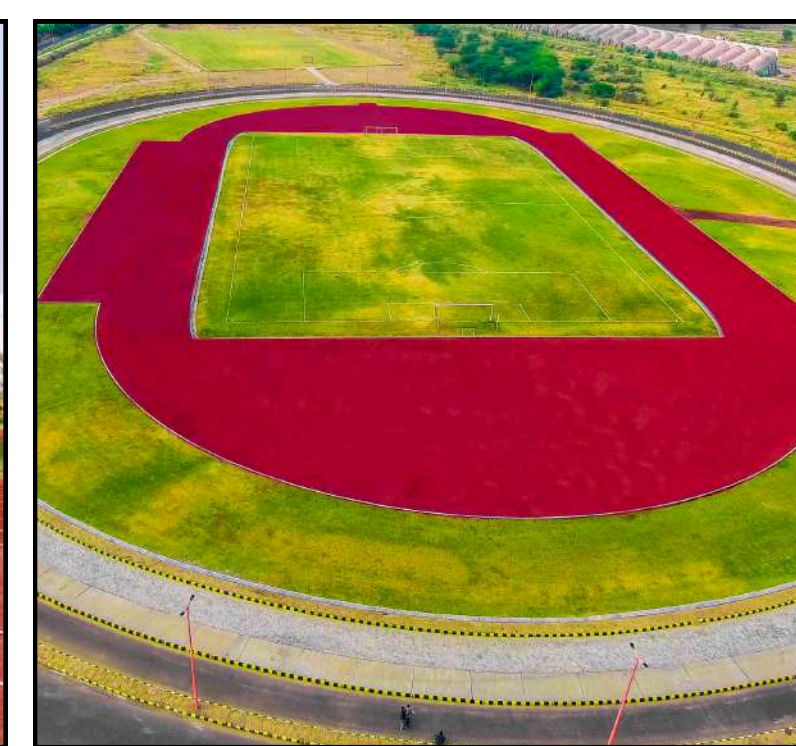

INDIAN FLAG

Every free nation of the world has its own flag. It is a symbol of a free country. The National Flag of India was adopted in its present form during the meeting of Constituent Assembly held on the 22 July 1947, a few days before India's independence from the British on 15 August, 1947. It served as the national flag of the Dominion of India between 15 August 1947 and 26 January 1950 and that of the Republic of India thereafter. In India, the term "tricolour" (tiranga) refers to the Indian national flag.

The National flag of India is a horizontal tricolor of deep saffron (kesari) at the top, white in the middle and dark green at the bottom in equal proportion. The ratio of width of the flag to its length is two to three. In the centre of the white band is a navy blue wheel which represents the chakra. Its design is that of the wheel which appears on the abacus of the Sarnath Lion Capital of Ashoka. Its diameter approximates to the width of the white band and it has 24 spokes.



The Do's:

- The National Flag may be hoisted in educational institutions (schools, colleges, sports camps, scout camps, etc.) to inspire respect for the Flag. An oath of allegiance has been included in the flag hoisting in schools.
- A member of public, a private organization or an educational institution may hoist/display the National Flag on all days and occasions, ceremonial or otherwise consistent with the dignity and honour of the National Flag.
- Section 2 of the new code accepts the right of all private citizens to fly the flag on their premises.

The Don'ts:

- The flag cannot be used for communal gains, drapery, or clothes. As far as possible, it should be flown from sunrise to sunset, irrespective of the weather.
- The flag cannot be intentionally allowed to touch the ground or the floor or trail in water. It cannot be draped over the hood, top, and sides or back of vehicles, trains, boats or aircraft.
- No other flag or bunting can be placed higher than the flag. Also, no object, including flowers or garlands or emblems can be placed on or above the flag. The tricolour cannot be used as a festoon, rosette or bunting.

INDIAN CURRENCY



The Indian Rupee (INR), the official currency of India, is issued by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) and is symbolized by ₹. The currency includes coins in denominations of 1, 2, 5, 10, and 20 rupees. Banknotes are available in denominations of 2, 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, 200, 500, and 2000 rupees. The banknotes feature various images, including Mahatma Gandhi, significant historical landmarks, and cultural symbols. The diversity in the types of notes and coins reflects India's rich heritage and plays a vital role in its economic transactions. The Reserve Bank of India continuously updates the security features of the banknotes to prevent counterfeiting and ensure the integrity of the currency. Each denomination has distinct color schemes and dimensions, aiding in easy identification.

Doctoral-Fellowship in India for ASEAN (DIA)

There is a special scheme for scholars from ASEAN countries to apply for PhD fellowships in IITs. The scheme aims to strengthen the deep and historical relations between India and ASEAN countries. Applicants may apply online, and the selected ones will get a chance to finish their PhD with funding at par with their Indian counterparts from the Government of India. The funding includes a monthly stipend and an annual research grant for up to 5 years of their PhD programme. Under Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)/Collaborations

A visiting student can carry out course work at IIT Jodhpur for a semester or spend up to a maximum of two semesters on Exchange Programme- Not for Degree. Admission of students under the MoU category will be made in accordance with the terms and conditions outlined in the MoU between IIT Jodhpur and the concerned University. Further, Students seeking admission will have to satisfy the minimum eligibility criteria for admission to the programmes as prescribed by the Institute. But merely fulfilling the minimum eligibility criteria does not guarantee the selection of a candidate into any program. The students of IIT Jodhpur also participate in foreign university for Joint Degree, Dual Degree Programme. **Direct admission of international students is also facilitated at IIT Jodhpur.**
