Kiran Kumar, Chairman, Board of Governors as the Chairman was attending the meeting of the Board of Governors, IIT Jodhpur for the first time. The Director also placed on record the gratitude on behalf of the Institute towards the immense contributions of Dr. R. Chidambaram, the outgoing Chairman, Board of Governors of IIT Jodhpur for his immense contributions to the significant development and overall growth of the Institute during his tenure.</p> <p>Later, Sh. A. S. Kiran Kumar, Chairman, BoG welcomed the members of the Board of Governors especially Dr. Manish Gupta, Joint Secretary, Technical Education, Govt. of Rajasthan who joined the meeting online.</p> <p>The Chairman further praised the contributions of Dr. R. Chidambaram as the Chairman, BoG of IIT Jodhpur during his tenure.</p> <p>The Chairman further emphasized that we all should work together with more enthusiasm towards the further development of the Institute and called the meeting in order.</p>
34.1.1	<p>To Confirm the Minutes of the 33rd Meeting of the Board of Governors held on 28th June, 2023 at Board Room, IIT Jodhpur</p> <p>The Board of Governors, confirmed the Minutes of the 33rd Meeting of the Board of Governors, as circulated.</p>

34.2 Institute Report by the Director, IIT Jodhpur

The Director presented the Institute Report before the Board of Governors as under:

1. The Institute is offering **89** Academic Programmes including the following New Academic Programmes starting from AY 2023-24:
 - MBA in Fin-Tech. and Cyber Security
 - M. DeS. in XR / Immersive Media
 - M. Tech. in Quantum Technologies
 - M. Tech. in Data Engineering
 - M.Sc.-M.Tech. in Chemistry and Materials Engineering
 - Ph.D. in Centre for Education & Technology for Education
 - M.Tech.-Ph.D. in Intelligent VLSI Systems
 - PG Diploma in Next Generation OMICS Technologies and Applications
 - M.S. by Research in the following **7** areas:
 - a. Centre of Excellence on Brain Science and Application
 - b. Centre for Mathematical and Computational Economics
 - c. Centre of Excellence in AI based Precision Healthcare
 - d. Centre for Emerging Technologies for Sustainable Development
 - e. Centre for Technology Foresight and Policy
 - f. Intelligent Infrastructure
 - g. Centre of Excellence on Art and Digital Immersion
 - Certificate in Data Analytics
2. The Board of Governors was also apprised that the present student strength is **4554** in the AY 2023-24;
3. The present Faculty strength is **261** and 27 faculty positions have been offered as on 27 October 2023;
4. Non-faculty strength has also been increased from 120 to **233** as of 27 October 2023;
5. The Financial parameters such as Status of Funds, Budget Sanction by the Ministry of Education (MoE) for F.Y. 2023-24, Grant Received, and Actual expenditure of 2023-24 were also briefed to the Board of Governors;
6. It was also apprised to the Board of Governors that the expected IRG for FY 2023-24 of the Institute would be approximately to the tune of ₹ 52 Crores;
7. It was also briefed that the funds received by the Institute under CSR to the tune of ₹145.57 Lakhs and a Philanthropic Donation of ₹ 70.00 crores.;
8. The progress made in securing Research & Development (R&D) projects and funds was also reported. It was briefed to the Board of Governors that 65 Projects and grants of ₹ 19.15 Crores have been sanctioned/received as compared to 51 and ₹ 12.72 Crores during the same period in the last Financial Year till 27th October, 2023; and
9. The Board of Governors further briefed that presently there are 14 Start-ups under the IIT Jodhpur Technology Innovation and Start-up Center (TISC Jodhpur).

New Initiatives at IIT Jodhpur

- A. The Director further apprised the Board of Governors that **Hon'ble Prime Minister** of India dedicated the Permanent Campus of IIT Jodhpur to the service of the Nation on 5th October, 2023.
- B. The Director also briefed the Board of Governors that Prof. Ajay Kumar Sood, Principal Scientific Adviser to the Government of India recently visited IIT Jodhpur in connection with the all S&T Cluster's meet during 26-27th October 2023. Prof. Sood also interacted with the Faculty Members of IIT Jodhpur during his visit.

C. Center for Digital Health- The Director further briefed the Board of Governors that IIT Jodhpur formed a Knowledge Alliance for Digital Health with the Industry Partner, M/s. Libra Social Research Foundation (LSRF)–Not-for-profit organization and the Institute has also collaborated with **Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission.**

The Center aims to Build up the strong inter-disciplinary academic ecosystem of IIT Jodhpur and will also focus on Health for all through digital transformation of healthcare involving cutting-edge research, state-of-the-art academic programmes, open data eco-system and disruptive innovations. The Center will work to make affordable digital healthcare reach to the people without corresponding increase in the requirement of physical infrastructure and human resources.

Major Initiatives @ IIT Jodhpur

1. **iHub Drishti, the Technology Innovation Hub (TIH):** iHub Drishti, the Technology Innovation Hub (TIH) at IIT Jodhpur, is a Section-8 Company, established under National Mission on Interdisciplinary Cyber-Physical System (NM-ICPS) in 2020.
2. **Jodhpur City Knowledge and Innovation Foundation (JCKIF):** JCKIF is one of the six S&T Clusters set up in the country by the Office of PSA, Government of India under the Prime Minister's Science, Technology and Innovation Advisory Council initiative.
3. **Technology Innovation & Start-up Centre (TISC):** IITJ-TISC, the umbrella incubation center of IITJ has also been incorporated as Section-8 Company, with a mandate to incubate Deep-Tech Startups along with the aim of developing a vibrant entrepreneurship ecosystem in the Institute and the larger region in the state of Rajasthan.
4. **Rishabh Centre for Research and Innovation in Clean Energy (RiCRICE)** for the purpose of conducting research and technology development in close collaboration with relevant industries, academia and other organizations in areas of Clean Energy. This centre is aimed at facilitating generation of commercialisable technologies for energy sustainability. This will be the first R&D Centre at IIT Jodhpur being set-up through philanthropic contributions.
5. **Ayurtech:** A Centre of Excellence in Ayurtech supported by the Ministry of Ayush with an outlay of ₹ 10 Cr. has been established recently at the Institute under the School of Artificial Intelligence and Data Science (AIDE), IITJ.
6. **Deep-Tech Biodesign Centre for Medical Technology:** To bring innovation in medical technology to our country, IIT Jodhpur in collaboration with AIIMS Jodhpur has established a Multi-disciplinary Biodesign Centre, funded by Department of Biotechnology, Government of India, to train, nurture and transform clinicians and engineers into the Deep-Tech innovators in the field of Medical / Health Technology.
7. **IIT Jodhpur - Jal Jeevan Mission Centre for Sustainable Drinking Water:** In January 2022, National Jal Jeevan Mission, Department of Drinking Water & Sanitation, Ministry of Jal Shakti has conveyed the sanction of the President of India and the Institute has set up JJM-Professor Chair on 'Sustainability of Drinking Water Sources' in IIT Jodhpur at a total cost of ₹ 6.02 crore for five years duration.

The School of Artificial Intelligence and Data Science (AIDE), IIT Jodhpur has Centres of Excellence to enable a group of faculty to focus on very specific areas for high quality research output and specialised courses. Centres of Excellence provide a unique and distinguished transdisciplinary capability to carry out high quality fundamental and translational research :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Brain Science and Applications ➤ Mathematical and Computational Economics ➤ Centre of Excellence in Intelligent Infrastructure ➤ Centre of Excellence in AI based Precision Healthcare <p>B. The Centre of Excellence for Arts and Digital Immersion (ADI) is an upcoming transdisciplinary center located within the School of Liberal Arts (SoLA) at IIT Jodhpur. It is envisioned as a futuristic research hub for exploring the intersections emerging from Art and Digital Technologies. It aims to excel in creative work in Visual arts, such as painting, sculpture, Performing Arts such as Theatre, Music, Dance, and other creative art forms. As for digital immersion, ADI encourages the use of digital technologies, such as Virtual Reality (VR), Augmented Reality (AR), Mixed Reality (MR), and Extended Reality (ER), all of which create an alternate or enhanced environment.</p> <p>C. 34.3.1	<p>To consider and approve the recommendations of the 30th Meeting of the Finance Committee scheduled for 31st October, 2023 (at 11:30 AM) in the Board Room, IIT Jodhpur</p> <p>The recommendations of the Finance Committee made in its 30th meeting held on 31st October, 2023 (at 11:30 AM) were presented before the Board of Governors. The BoG approved the recommendations of the 30th Meeting of the Finance Committee as under:</p>

30.2.2: Revised Estimates FY 2023-24 and Budget Estimates FY 2024-25

On the recommendation of the Finance Committee made in its 30th Meeting held on 31st October, 2023, the Board of Governors approved the following:

1. Revised Budget Estimates for the F. Y. 2023-24 and Budget Estimates for the F. Y. 2024-25; and
2. Suggested the Institute to request the Ministry of Education to sanction atleast an additional Budget of ₹93.90 Crores for the F. Y. 2023-24 to enable the Institute to effectively manage its core activities.

The Board also approved the following recommendation of the Finance Committee and suggested to the Institute to take necessary action:

- To present the cash flow at the time of budget discussion in the Finance Committee in the future;
- To take into account all the demands as per increased sanctioned strength in Budget Estimates judiciously;
- Appropriate Explanatory notes should be given for specific Budget Heads, having significant changes in two consecutive financial years; and
- Additional fields of budget may be added, if required, for better clarity and comparability while analyzing the overall Budget proposal.

30.2.4: To consider and approve the rationalization of the Non-Faculty Positions as per the revised sanctioned strength by the Ministry of Education

The Board of Governors noted the approval of the Ministry of Education, Govt. of India conveyed vide Letter No. F. No. 12-12/2018-TS-I dated 04th October, 2023 towards the increase of sanctioned strength of Faculty and Non-faculty positions in line with the already approved ratio by the Ministry of Education as below:
