		The Chairman, BoG, welcomed all the members of the Board of Governors, especially Dr. Manish Gupta, Joint Secretary, Department of Technical Education, Govt. of Rajasthan who was attending the meeting as a representative of State Govt. Nominee for the first time.			
		The Chairman interacted with Dr. Gupta and requested to explore the possibilities of linkages between IIT Jodhpur and the Govt. of Rajasthan in terms of technological interventions towards societal upliftment. Dr. Gupta said that Govt. of Rajasthan would certainly move forward in the direction of taking technical expertise from IIT Jodhpur towards the cause. Then, the Chairman, BoG called the meeting in order.

		The Board of Governors confirmed the Minutes of the 28 <sup>th</sup> BoG meeting held on 11.02.2022, as circulated.			

### 29.1.2 Presentation by the two faculty members on their research work /accomplishments before the BoG.

As per the decision of the BoG taken in its 24<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on 5.12.2020, the following two Faculty Members of the Institute made presentations before the BoG about their research work:

#### 1. Dr. Dipanjan Roy

Dr. Dipanjan Roy, Associate Professor, Centre for Brain Science and Applications, School of AIDE presented his research work about Characterizing Brain network dynamics and mechanisms underlying brain state switching, cognitive flexibility, and multisensory processing.

Dr. Roy briefed the BoG that a challenging problem in cognitive neuroscience is to relate the structural connectivity (SC) to the functional connectivity (FC) to better understand how large-scale network dynamics underlying human cognition emerges from the relatively fixed SC architecture. Dr. Roy, shows through PPT how cognitive function emerges by characterizing brain states using neurodynamical models. He also presented recent works capturing interindividual variability of multisensory speech perception and biophysical models to explain mechanistically such variability based on auditory and visual areas' time-scale separation. And ongoing effort at IIT Jodhpur EEG Lab to better understand brain-behavior correlation and causation using brain recordings during human behaviour and concurrent neurostimulation.

The Chairman, BoG, and Members praised a variety of approaches in experimental and theoretical research works encompassing mathematical modeling and advanced machine learning techniques along with data analytics using behavioral and brain data.

The BoG suggested Dr. Roy continue along with the same line of research as well as including the possibility of exploring brain mapping in individuals with substance abuse, the possibility of extending behavioral recordings in virtual reality experiments, and brain-machine interfacing to explore exciting future research avenues.

#### 2. Dr. Farhat Naz

Dr. Farhat Naz, Assistant Professor, Department of Humanities & Social Sciences, presented her ongoing research contributions on Water stress and vulnerable livelihoods of desert ecosystem communities in the Thar region. The research highlighted the water stress/scarcity faced by the local communities in the midst of rising climate change and desertification in the Western Rajasthan. Dr. Farhat also presented her achievements in terms of awards, recognitions, research grants and publications.

The Director suggested Dr. Farhat be associated with Prof. Pradip Tiwari on how to get involved in his water project to address social aspect of the Project/research.

Prof. Mitali Mukerji, Member, BoG also suggested Dr. Farhat to be associated with her also in her research work.

The Chairman, BoG also suggested to Dr. Farhat to also explore linking her research work with the team of Prof. P.K. Tewari, Deptt. of Chemical Engineering working on the area to provide drinkable water to the marginal peoples and schools located at rural areas.

The Chairman, BoG, and Members appreciated the presentations made by Dr. Roy and Dr. Farhat.

29.3.1	To consider and approve the recommendations of the 25 <sup>th</sup> Meeting of the Finance Committee held on 16 June 2022 at IIT Jodhpur.
	The Director briefed the Board of Governors that the 25 <sup>th</sup> meeting of the Finance Committee was held on 16 June 2022 in the IIT Jodhpur and then presented the recommendations of the Finance Committee before the BoG. The BoG approved the recommendations of the 25 <sup>th</sup> Meeting of the Finance Committee, made observations on the following items, and approved as under:
	25.1.2: Funding support from the Industry
	The Board noted and approved the following recommendation of the Finance Committee on the matter of funding support from the Industry:
	"The Finance Committee appreciated the efforts made by the Director, IIT Jodhpur towards the betterment of the Institute and also agreed in principle that Institute should take all necessary steps to get the funding support from the industry, Alumni, and other sources. For this purpose, Institute should approach different possible donors through its Section 8 company IIT Jodhpur Marudhara Foundation and if required the Institute may provide the initial financial support to the IIT Jodhpur Marudhara Foundation as a loan. FC also noted the possibility of fund generation and creation of research infrastructure in the innovation park through partnerships with private and public sector industries and agencies.
	After detailed deliberations, the Finance Committee noted the need of the Institute and accord its in-principle approval and suggest the Institute come back with a detailed proposal to the Finance Committee in its next meeting for the operational requirement of the Marudhara foundation."
	25.1.4: Payment of HRA at par with "Y" Class city to the employees as an interim measure.
	The Board also noted the following on the matter of HRA as per "Y" Class city:
	"The FC noted that employees of Kendriya Vidyalaya, IIT Jodhpur have approached the Central Administrative Tribunal (CAT) seeking for grant of HRA at 'Y' Class city rates and have included Director, IIT Jodhpur as one of the respondents and IIT Jodhpur is constrained by not paying the HRA at par with 'Y' Class city to its own employees (and the employees of KV, IIT Jodhpur) for the want of approval from the Ministry. IIT has placed all the communications with the ministry before the CAT.
	The Director briefed the FC that the Institute has informed the same to the Ministry of Education. Sh. Rakesh Ranjan, AS (TE), MoE suggested that Institute should place all the communications with the ministry to CAT. The Director informed the FC that Institute has already placed the matter to the CAT and prayed to the CAT that MoE may be involved in the process as IIT can not take any action in this matter without MoE's approval."

#### 25.1.4: Recruitment and Promotion Rules for non-faculty positions 2021

"The Director apprised the FC that after the adoption of the new Recruitment & Promotion Rules 2021, many Staff Members who went on lien to other Institutions joined back the Institute. The FC appreciated the same."

#### 25.2.1: Statement of Expenditure as of 31 May 2022

The Board noted and approved the following recommendation of the Finance Committee:

"The Finance Committee noted the fund position of the Institute as of 31 May 2022. The FC discussed the existing fund position under all three Object Heads. The Finance Committee also noted that in case there is any delay in the release of funds, Institute can meet the expenditure from its internal resources, and recoup the amount after receiving funds from the MoE."

#### 25.2.2: Annual Accounts for the Financial Year 2021-22

The Board noted and approved the following recommendation of the Finance Committee:

"The Finance Committee discussed the Annual Accounts for the FY 2021-22 of the Institute in length and also noted the comments received from the IFD, Division, Ministry of Education on the Annual Accounts.

It was apprised to the FC that the system of receiving funds through the Treasury Single Account (TSA) has been implemented in the Institute during the FY, i.e. 2021-22. Therefore, no interest was accrued over grants released during the reported Year. However, the interest accrued over on the grants for the FY 2020-21 has already been remitted to MoE, Govt. of India, and accordingly Institute has also sent the updated Utilization Certificate (UC) for the FY 2020-21 incorporating remittance of interest accrued over grants to the MoE.

The FC also apprised that hike in expenditure in FY 2021-22 was due to an increase in the Student, Staff, and Faculty strength, the establishment of new Department/ School/ Centres etc., and recalling the students coming back to the Campus after relaxation in COVID norms.

The FC noted the same and recommend the Annual Accounts for the Financial Year 2021-22 to the Board of Governors for approval."

	The Director apprised the Board that an agreement to set up joint venture Section- 8 company has been signed on 24th February 2022 by and between Indian Institute of Technology Jodhpur, Jodhpur City knowledge and Innovation Foundation (JCKIF) and RajComp Info Services Ltd. (RISL), (formerly RajCOMP) a Government of Rajasthan undertaking to establish a state-in-art AIOT Innovation Hub at the institute and for scouting/leveraging resources from various Government funding/projects/programs for garnering/ augmenting infrastructure funds in establishing the AIOT Innovation hub and operationalising the new setup for the benefit of researchers, start-ups, industries and other end-users in and around the region of Jodhpur, users in the remaining regions of the state of Rajasthan and beyond.
	It was further apprised to the BoG that three parties are interested in working together to Jointly incorporate a new Section 8 company under the Companies Act 2013 as a Joint Venture with primary objective of establishing a state-in-art AIOT Innovation Hub at IITJ and operating the setup through the newly established corporate Joint Venture. The AIOT Innovation Hub shall be the first of its kind in the state of Rajasthan and the infrastructure so created shall be leveraged by users across the state of Rajasthan and beyond.
